



FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY FOR SLSJ GRADUATE AT SECTION27: 2017

We are pleased to announce that applications are open for the year long SLSJ SECTION27 Fellowship .

The fellowship programme is designed to give the appointed fellow practical legal experience by working at the SECTION27 offices. The job will build legal, policy, mobilization and leadership capacity of the fellow. The fellow is required to support the work of the attorney to whom he/ she is assigned, by undertaking legal and field research for the designated supervisors work on policy, advocacy and litigation.

The fellows will be expected to provide ongoing support to SLSJ.

Fellows will be required to work from SECTION27's offices in Johannesburg for the duration of the Programme. All final year law students and master's students who are active members of SLSJ are invited to apply.

FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS, INSTRUCTIONS AND CRITERIA

The application deadline is Friday 16 September 2016 at 17h00.

Candidates selected for an interview will be notified on or before Monday 26 September 2016.

Interviews will take place during the first week of October 2016.

All applications must include:

- A Curriculum Vitae;
- A motivational letter detailing the applicant's suitability for the fellowship and involvement in SLSJ activities;
- An example of any relevant piece of the applicant's original writing between 1000 and 1500 words;
- A full academic transcript; and
- Contact details for three referees.

All applicants are required:

- To possess an LLB from a South African university;
- To have good research and writing skills;
- To demonstrate commitment to social justice and evidence of active and consistent involvement in social justice work; and
- To show knowledge of SECTION27's mandate, work areas and current work.

Applicants' social and economic backgrounds including disability, gender, race, class and the relative challenges faced in their university environment will be highly considered.

Additional desirable attributes which will assist a candidate in their application include:

- Proficiency in multiple South African languages; and
- Volunteering or work experience in legal, human rights, organizing campaigns or campaigning.
